# Arab Regional Conference Evaluation Report

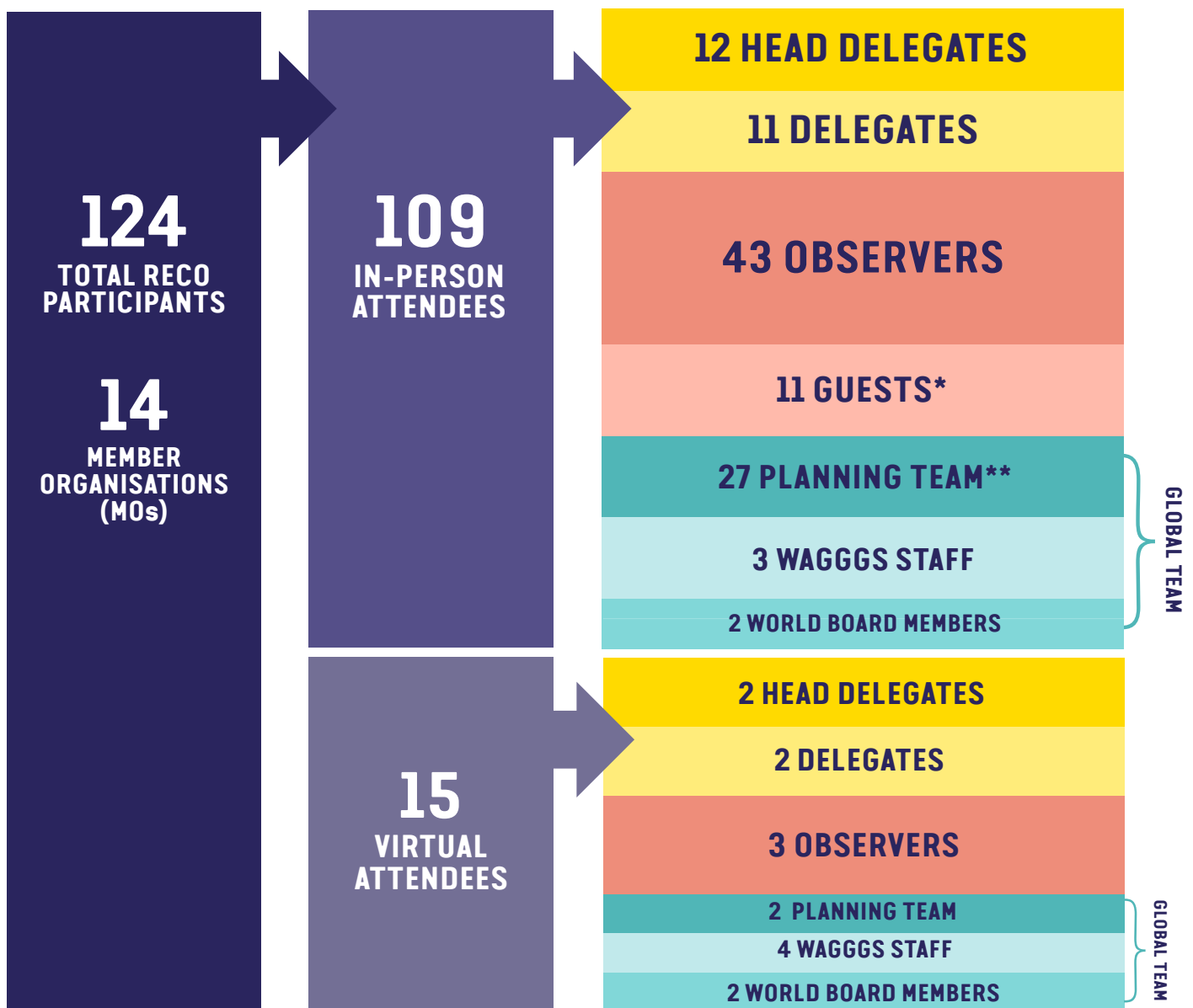

# OVERVIEW

Welcome to the report of the 24<sup>TH</sup> Arab Regional Conference, our first-ever hybrid Regional Conference (ReCo), where participants joined both in person in Algeria and virtually from across the region.

The Conference was held from 9th to 11th August 2025. This was complemented by the Young Women Forum which took place from 7<sup>th</sup> to 9<sup>th</sup> August 2025.

After the Conference, all Head Delegates were invited to complete an evaluation survey. The following report provides a summary of the Regional Conference feedback received through the evaluation.



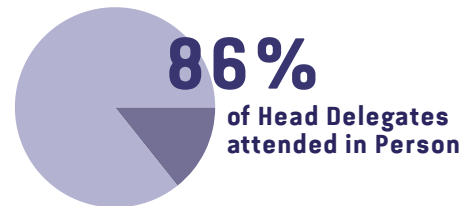
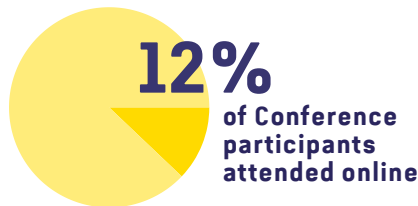
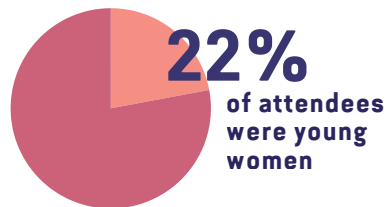
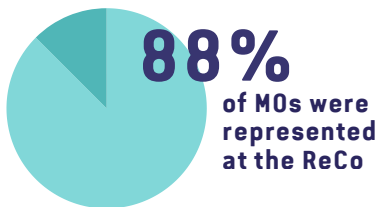
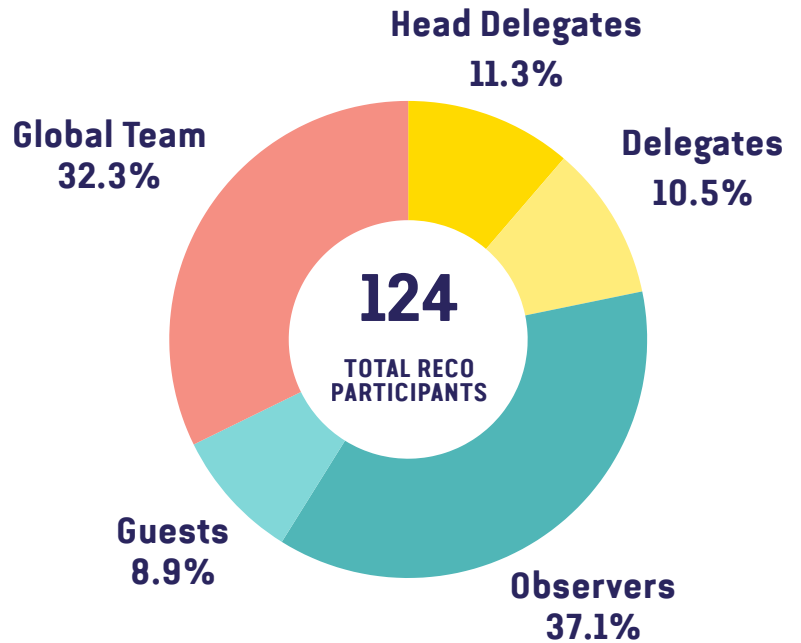
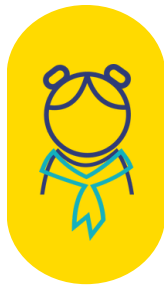

**A total of 124 Conference participants took part in the event, with 109 attending in person and 15 joining virtually, representing 14 MOs.**

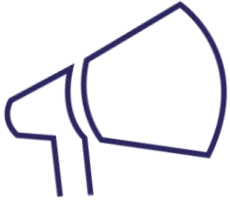

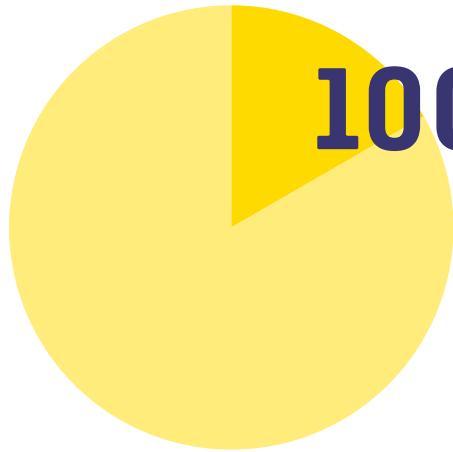

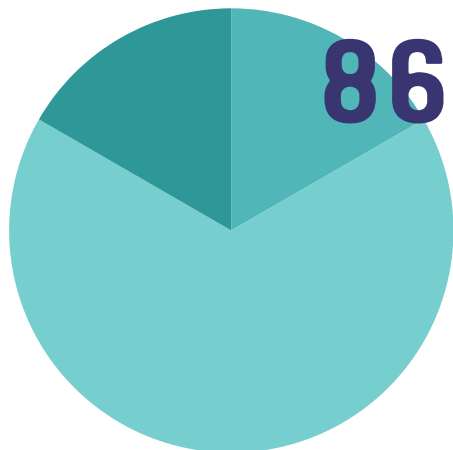

## What Worked Well



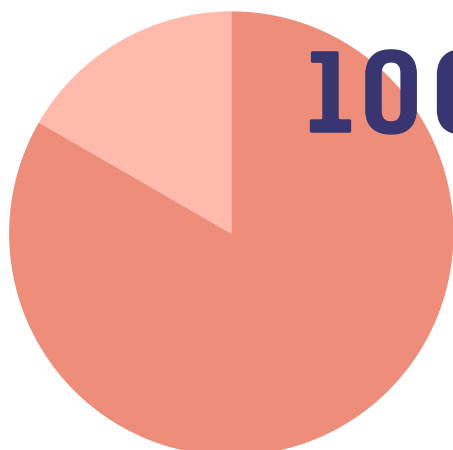
**100%** of the respondents said that the Regional Conference programme was relevant to them and their delegations.

**86%** of the respondents said that there were enough spaces and sessions that enabled productive discussion and interaction.

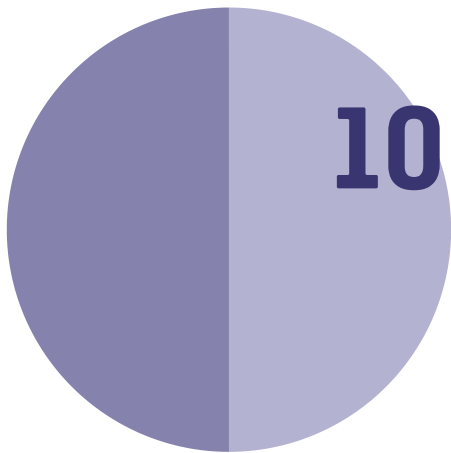

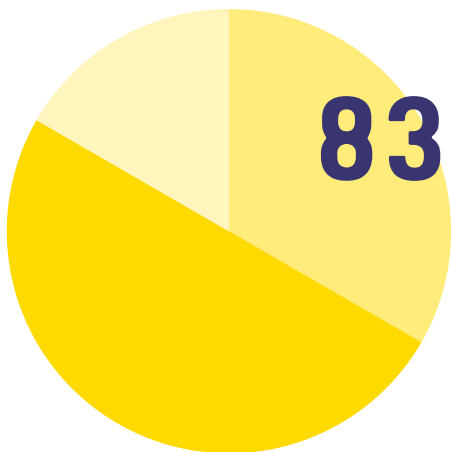
## What Worked Well

of the respondents said that there was meaningful youth participation during the Regional Conference, noting that young people were actively engaged, informed, empowered, safe, and valued in their contributions.

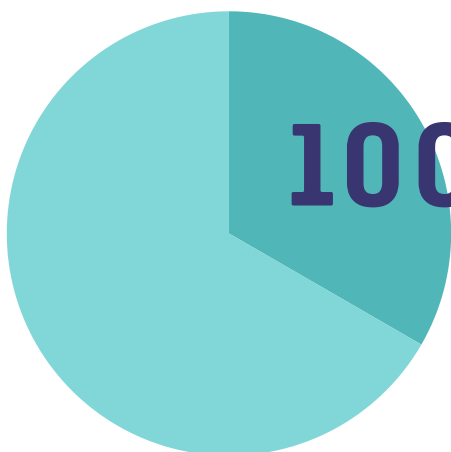

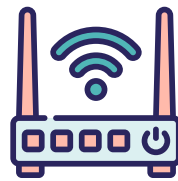
of the respondents who answered this question said that participation in the Youth Pre-Event enhanced their delegation's experience at the Regional Conference.

## What Could Have Worked Better (Online)

- Several challenges when attending the Conference virtually were highlighted. The most common issue was internet connection problems.
- Unstable connections disrupted participation, affecting the ability to follow discussions and fully engage in sessions.

- Another frequently cited challenge was feeling excluded from decision-making & Technological platform unfamiliarity
- Difficulty staying engaged was also raised as a concern.



## What Could Have Worked Better (in person)

- Keep Regional Conferences in person
- Offering more grants and financial contribution.
- Clearer communication and earlier notice of events.

# MEANINGFUL YOUTH PARTICIPATION

Participants shared a range of ideas on how meaningful youth participation at WAGGGS events could be further strengthened.



## Establishing an Advisory Young Women's Committee:

It is elected from within the Arab Young Women's Forum, and its role is to accompany the Arab Regional Committee, provide advice, and represent the voice of young women, without having the right to vote.

## Enhancing the inclusion of girls with disabilities

in major Arab Region activities, while ensuring the provision of an appropriate and supportive environment that enables them to participate effectively and helps overcome all challenges related to different disabilities.

## Establishing a regional platform for young women

focused on learning, cultural exchange, and the development of personal and leadership skills, including principles of governance and community participation, to strengthen the role of young women at all levels

## Adopting an annual, recurring activity for young women

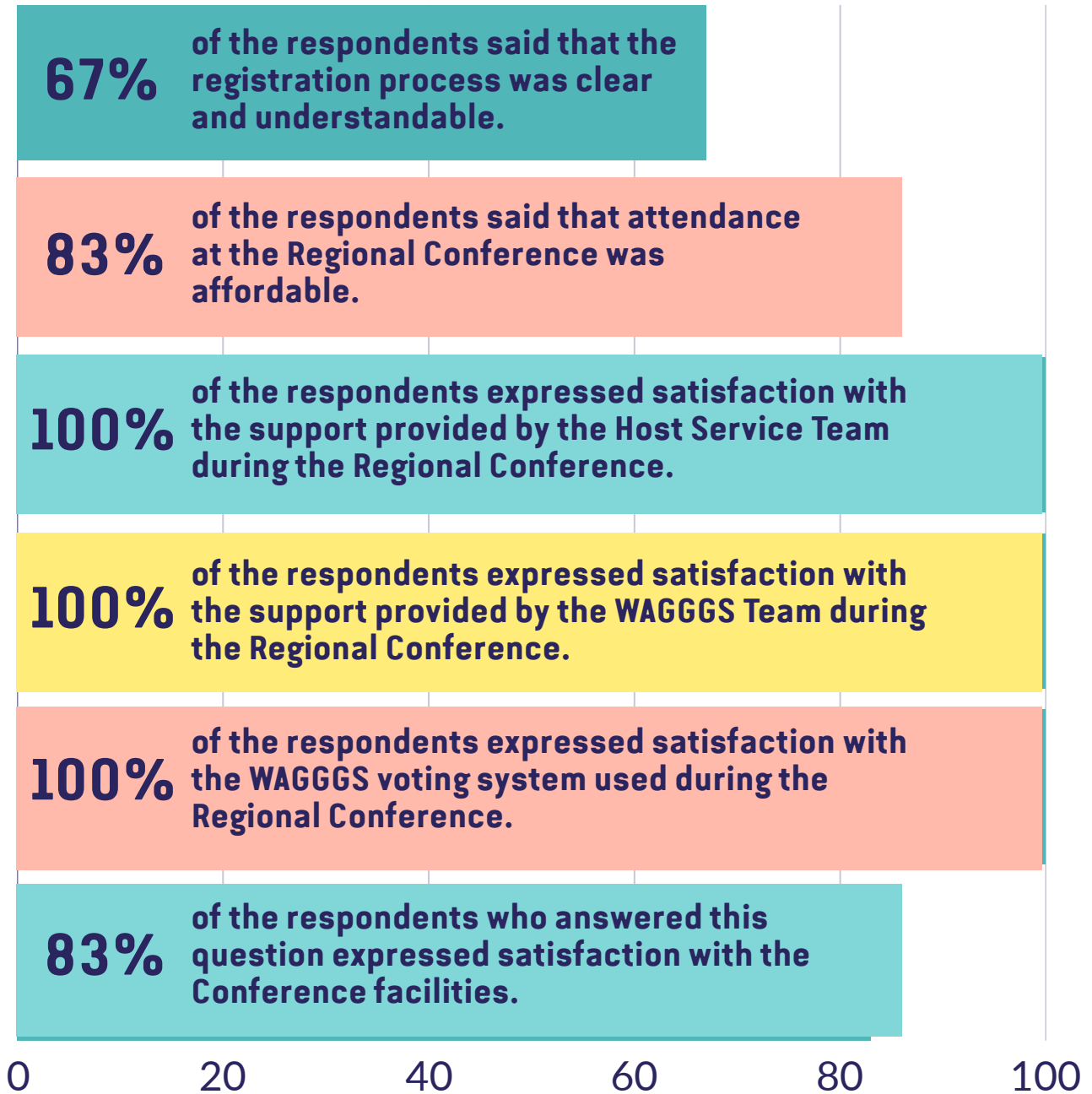
in the Arab Region, which allows for the exchange of experiences, staying informed about new developments, and monitoring the implementation of the regional young women's action plan, ensuring continuity of communication and collaboration.

## Expanding participation opportunities for Arabic-speaking young women

at the regional and global levels, while ensuring the availability of multiple spaces and languages (Arabic, English, French, and others), enabling them to participate effectively and exchange experiences with their peers from diverse backgrounds and languages.

# REFLECTIONS FOR FUTURE REGIONAL CONFERENCES

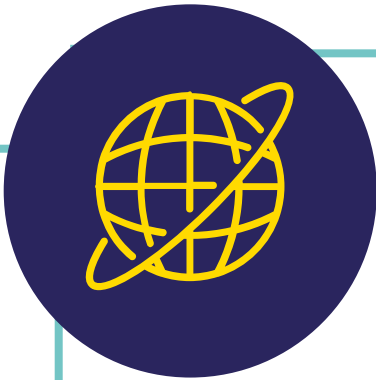
## Affordability & Financial Support

Reduce registration, travel, and accommodation costs where possible, and explore grants to support Member Organisations, particularly the young women delegates.



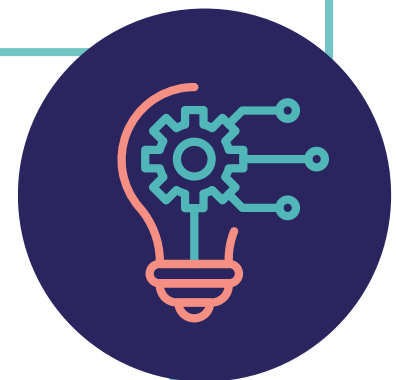
## Hybrid & Online Options
