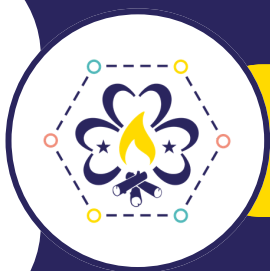


# Capacity Assessment Tool (CAT 2.0)

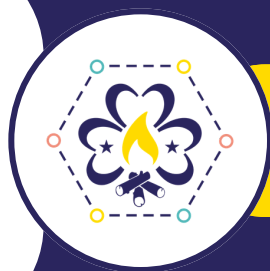
# WAGGGS Global Forum 2026 Kusafiri

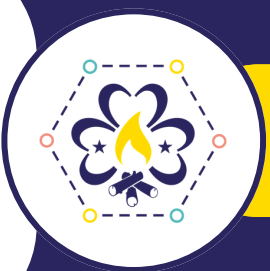

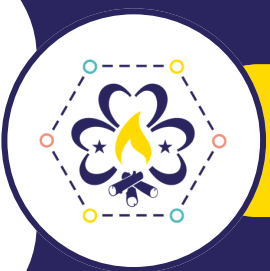


# When Girls Lead for Peace (Juliette Low Seminar 2028)
