INTRODUCTION

This document sets out a narrative summary of the discussions held during the 39th World Conference and the Record of Decisions voted on by Member Organisations. The Conference was held from 16 to 19 June 2026, with delegates participating in person in Cambodia and online where Member Organisations were unable to be present in person.

QUORUM

During the Opening Business session of the World Conference, the Chair of the World Board confirmed that the conference was quorate, and this remained the case across all voting sessions. The list of Member Organisations that participated in the World Conference can be found in Appendix 1.

A count of Member Organisations present was taken at the start of each voting session during the conference. An electronic voting system combined with manual tallying of the recorded votes by the appointed Tellers was used for all counted votes during the conference. Head Delegates joined, left and re-joined the sessions periodically, and thus not all Head Delegates participated in every vote in the respective voting sessions. Only Head Delegates present at the roll call could vote in that specific voting session.

In total, there were 103 Member Organisations present during the Conference (102 Full Member Organisations and 1 Associate Member Organisation). This includes two Potential Member Organisations (Faroe Islands and Morocco) that were approved as Full Member Organisations during the conference and assumed voting rights immediately after admission.

A further 10 Member Organisations (9 Full Member Organisations and 1 Associate Member Organisation) registered for the conference but did not attend according to the roll call.

SUMMARY OF VOTING ON PROCEDURAL MOTIONS

The following Procedural Motions were considered during the Opening Business of the World Conference. All four Procedural Motions were proposed by the World Board and required a simple majority of votes cast by eligible Full and Associate Member Organisations to pass.

Following the presentation of each Proposed Motion and Proposed Amendment, the Conference Chair opened the discussion and Member Organisations present discussed the Proposed Motions and Proposed Amendments before voting.

In total 36 Member Organisations spoke during the discussion. Of those speaking, 43 percent were young women under the age of thirty at the time of the conference. In total, 20 percent of all Head Delegates that participated in the conference were under the age of thirty at the time of the conference.

During the discussion, the following points were raised by Member Organisations and noted:

Procedural Motion B

- The World Board supported the motion, explaining that the changes were intended to strengthen the Board's skills and governance capacity. It noted that competency areas had been communicated in advance and that, for the current triennium, priorities included expertise in areas such as finance.
- Scouterna argued that the implications of the changes had not been fully understood. Scouterna stressed that its opposition was not directed at the candidates themselves but at the democratic principles underlying the process.
- The Girl Scouts of the Philippines questioned whether the competency-based approach was consistent with the Constitution, expressing concern that Member Organisations would effectively be limited to confirming the “most qualified” candidates rather than making a genuine electoral choice.
- Guías de México opposed the changes, arguing that leadership should be developed within the Movement and that all candidates should have equal opportunities regardless of predefined skills categories.
- Ring Deutscher Pfadfinder*innenverbände e.V. (rdp) expressed that concerns about the use of competency areas had already been raised during earlier consultations and argued that rejecting the motion would better protect democratic processes.
- In response, the World Board explained that the Rules of Procedure are reviewed every triennium and emphasised that, if the motion failed, the organisation would simply revert to the 2023 rules.

Motion 1

- Związek Harcerstwa Polskiego (ZHP) worried that shorter terms would reduce continuity and give board members less time to settle into their roles.
- The Hong Kong Girl Guides Association supported shorter terms to increase accountability and create more opportunities for young women.
- Asociación Guías Argentinas supported the World Board's recommendation based on its experience.
- The World Board argued that three-year terms better reflect young women's preferences and that continuity risks are low because of staff support and possible re-election.

Motion 2

- Girl Guides Australia supported the proposal, saying it would strengthen regional representation.
- The Association Nationale des Guides de Centrafrique opposed it, arguing that reducing the number of representatives would increase the Board's workload.
- The World Board said the goal was to create a more strategic and efficient structure without harming leadership capacity.

Amendment 2.1

- The World Board opposed the amendment, arguing that it would create two categories of Board members and weaken collective leadership while reducing regional representation.
- Pfadfinder und Pfadfinderinnen Liechtensteins (PPL) emphasized the importance of Regional Chairs remaining on the World Board for communication between regions and the global level.
- Związek Harcerstwa Polskiego (ZHP) questioned whether the proposed structure would still provide adequate global representation.
- Scouterna argued that regional voices would remain influential even without voting Regional Chairs and proposed alternative mechanisms and stronger links between the World Board and regional committees.

Motion 3

- Scouting Nederland (SN) strongly supported the motion and opposed Amendment 3.1, arguing that co-option helps fill skill gaps.
- Speiderne i Norge questioned whether co-opted trustees should have voting rights.
- GirlGuiding New Zealand explained that co-opted voting members strengthen governance in its own system.
- The Association Nationale des Guides de Centrafrique raised concerns about consultation and timing.
- The World Board argued that co-opted trustees need voting rights to contribute fully and to be fully accountable.

Amendment 3.1

- Uganda Girl Guides Association and Cote D'Ivoire supported limiting voting rights.
- Girl Guides of Canada and Speiderne i Norge discussed accountability concerns.
- The World Board opposed the amendment, arguing that all Board members should work as equal peers and therefore co-opted members should retain voting rights. They noted that only one co-opted position is available and that any co-option must be approved by the Board, so creating a non-voting category would unnecessarily produce a two-tier Board.

Motion 4

- La Fédération Libanaise des Eclaireuses et des Guides asked whether Regional Conferences held during World Conference would retain their current powers.
- Asociación Guías Argentinas supported closer alignment of regional and world governance.
- The Girl Scouts of the Philippines opposed the proposal because of logistical, financial, and participation concerns.
- Persatuan Pandu Puteri Malaysia / Girl Guides Association Malaysia noted both advantages and disadvantages.
- The World Board confirmed that Regional Conferences would retain their formal powers.

Motion 5

- GirlGuiding New Zealand and Girl Guides Association of Cambodia support the motion emphasizing on accessibility and inclusion.
- Girl Guides of Canada stressed that financial barriers could hinder some Member Organisations from making their voices heard.
- The World Board recognized both the value of in-person meetings and the growing importance of remote participation.

Motion 6

- Topic: Representation of territories.
- Pigespejdernes Fællesråd Danmark (PFD) supported the motion and highlighted the importance of giving the Føroya Skótaráð their own voice.

Motion 7

- The World Board clarified that the proposal would not change the criteria for becoming a full member or the 75% requirement. The motion will just reflect current practices allowing Member Organisations to better engage with WAGGGS.

Motion 8

- Soma Hellinikou Odigismou (SHO) and the Association Nationale des Guides de Centrafrique argued that vice-chairs should retain voting and representation rights.
- The World Board explained that charity law prevents trustees from delegating their responsibilities.

Motion 9

- The World Board described the proposal as a minor technical update and noted that it would not substantially change governance.

Motion 10

- No discussion was recorded.

Motion 11

- Federazione Italiana Dello Scautismo (FIS) argued that regions already exist in practice and should be reflected in the Constitution.
- Ring Deutscher Pfadfinder*innenverbände e.V. (rdp) emphasized democratic ownership of regional structures.
- The World Board warned that putting too much detail into the Constitution reduces flexibility over time.

Motion 12

- Comité de Enlace del Guidismo en España (CEGE) supported strengthening regional engagement.
- The World Board reaffirmed its commitment to Regional Conferences and supported improving their role.

Amendment 12.1

- GirlGuiding New Zealand supported the proposal, arguing that it would allow each region to decide how often to meet and to adapt its governance arrangements to its own needs and circumstances.
- Mouvement Scout de Suisse (MSdS) framed the amendment as a choice about regional autonomy, arguing that Member Organisations that supported Motion 4 should also support Amendment 12.1 because the two proposals were closely linked.
- The World Board supported the amendment because it believed it resolved inconsistencies between Motion 12 and Motion 4.

Amendment 12.2

- The World Board opposed the amendment because Regional Conferences should mainly provide spaces for consultation, dialogue and Member Organisations' input into WAGGGS' six-year strategy. The Board emphasised that the World Conference is WAGGGS' highest decision-making authority and that decisions made there apply across all Member Organisations.
- Mouvement Scout de Suisse (MSdS) explained that the amendment reflects practices already followed in several regions, and that formal motions and voting are important because they provide a clear and guaranteed way for every Member Organisation to be heard.

Motion 13

- Girl Guides of Canada supported stronger governance processes.
- Pigespejdernes Fællesråd Danmark (PFD) warned against over-regulation.
- Fédération du Scoutisme Français (FSF) emphasised transparency and financial accountability.
- The World Board said the motion formalised existing practice.

Amendment 13.1

- Discussed together with Motion 13.

Motion 14

- The World Board emphasised that safeguarding is already a priority but questioned whether a single framework could work across all Member Organisations.
- Girlguiding UK supported stronger safeguarding in principle while arguing that any standards should remain flexible and practical.
- Les Scouts Musulmans d'Algerie argued that the motion would establish minimum standards and help create safer environments for girls and young women.

Amendment 14.1

- The World Board supported the amendment because it introduced greater flexibility while maintaining strong safeguarding standards.
- Ring Deutscher Pfadfinder*innenverbände e.V. (rdp) emphasised the importance of safe spaces and encouraged collaboration with WOSM to align safeguarding practices.

- Suomen Partiolaiset - Finlands Scouter ry clarified that the amendment was intended to allow WAGGGS to explore the best approaches while taking different national contexts into account.

Motion 15

- The World Board supported the motion and highlighted the work already being done to improve accessibility and multilingual participation.
- Asociación de Muchachas Guías de Panamá argued that language barriers limit participation in global discussions and that greater accessibility would strengthen engagement.
- Girl Guides Association of Cambodia emphasised that many girls and young women are excluded from debates because they cannot participate in English.
- Bharat Scouts and Guides thanked the Member Organisations supporting the proposal and encouraged its adoption.

Amendment 15.1

- The World Board supported the amendment because it introduced flexibility while broader policies on artificial intelligence are being developed.
- Girl Scouts of Taiwan argued that artificial intelligence could be used responsibly to support translation and improve accessibility.
- Scouteria clarified that the amendment was intended to avoid making AI mandatory while still allowing WAGGGS to explore its potential benefits.

Motion 16

- Girl Guides Association of Cambodia supported greater inclusion and cultural expression.
- Les Scouts Musulmans d'Algerie emphasised that the motion clarifies current policies and does not politicise them.
- The World Board noted that the communications policies are already under review and that if adopted the motion can be used during the upcoming review

Motion 17

- The World Board emphasised the diversity of Member Organisations and the many ways in which they put WAGGGS' mission into practice.
- Soma Hellinikou Odigismou (SHO) argued that clearer frameworks would strengthen the Movement's mission and help address questions about participation and identity.
- Guidisme et Scoutisme en Belgique (GSB) stressed that the motion was intended to encourage reflection and research rather than change WAGGGS' identity.

Motion 18

- Sri Lanka Girl Guides Association highlighted the financial barriers that prevent many Member Organisations from participating fully in international events.
- Scouteria argued that WAGGGS should explore more affordable options to make participation more accessible.
- The World Board acknowledged accessibility concerns.

Motion 19

- No discussion was recorded.

Motion 20

- No discussion was recorded.

Motion 21

- No discussion was recorded.

Motion 22

- No discussion was recorded.

Motion 23

- Soma Hellinikou Odigismou (SHO) and Comité de Enlace del Guidismo en España (CEGE) delivered a statement about conflict and safety.
- Sri Lanka Girl Guides Association stressed collective responsibility.
- Suomen Partiolaiset - Finlands Scouter ry clarified that the motion creates no additional obligations.
- The World Board supported the proposal.

Motion 24

- The World Board explained that committee mandates and terms of reference are reviewed every triennium and that the motion would be considered as part of that process.
- Skotisma Zazavavy eto Madagasikara argued that the motion would strengthen democratic governance and improve clarity around committee roles.
- Mouvement Scout de Suisse (MSdS) emphasised the importance of transparency and clear criteria grounded in the Constitution.
- The Girl Scouts of the Philippines supported stronger review mechanisms while preserving democratic choice.

Motion 25

- The World Board acknowledged the importance of balancing transparency with confidentiality and committed to reviewing Nominations Committee processes.
- Fédération Ivoirienne du Scoutisme Féminin emphasised the need for greater transparency, fairness and feedback to Member Organisations.
- The Girl Scouts of the Philippines argued that the motion aimed to strengthen trust and participation rather than weaken the role of the Nominations Committee.

Motion 26

- The World Board supported the motion and committed to publishing a framework and consulting Member Organisations.
- Pigespejdernes Fællesråd Danmark (PFD) questioned whether changes were necessary, arguing that its own experience with membership processes had been transparent and positive.
- Fédération du Scoutisme Français (FSF) argued that clearer procedures would promote fairness and ensure that all Member Organisations better understand the membership process.

Motion 27

- The World Board noted that support mechanisms already exist but welcomed efforts to strengthen knowledge-sharing between Member Organisations.
- Bharat Scouts and Guides presented the motion as an expression of solidarity and volunteerism.
- Soma Hellinikou Odigismou (SHO) offered to share its experience in responding to natural disasters.

- Pakistan Girl Guides Association highlighted disaster-management resources developed in partnership with UNICEF.
- Les Scouts Tunisiens clarified that the aim was to document and share good practices rather than replace existing systems.

Motion 28

- The World Board supported preserving WAGGGS heritage in principle but expressed concern about the financial and staffing resources required.
- Hong Kong Girl Guides Association described local initiatives to preserve history through documentaries and digital archives.
- Girlguiding UK and Scouteria warned that, from experience, heritage projects can be resource intensive.
- Les Scouts Tunisiens argued that preserving WAGGGS' heritage would benefit all Member Organisations.

Motion 29

- The World Board welcomed the intention of the motion and noted that the committee responsible is planning a review. If adopted, it would be possible to incorporate the motion in its existing work.
- Bharat Scouts and Guides supported greater recognition of volunteers and their contributions to the Movement.
- Girl Guides Association of Cambodia argued that recognition systems should reflect the diversity of Member Organisations and volunteers.
